

Steps to planning your organisation's event



Step 1 - Pick your day

Pick a day in September that works well in your organisation's calendar and take advantage of the September footy finals fever to inject some serious fun and playful team rivalry amongst your colleagues to help kids with cancer.

Step 2 - Decide what you want to do

Decide what will work best for your organisation whether it's a morning or afternoon tea, a BBQ, Friday night drinks or any thing else that might engage your co-workers. Rather than asking for a gold coin donation, try asking people to donate what they would normally spend for that occasion.

Make your event more fun by adding a dress up competition, an auction or raffle, a fine box, footy tipping or handball competitions. The sky's the limit!

Step 3 - Promote your event

There are many ways to spread the word to your colleagues - send out an email, use your Intranet or noticeboards, add a message in your newsletter or tap into the power of social media and send out an event message.

Step 4 - On the day
